Administration of medicines at school

For the sake of our new parents, we would just like to remind you of the arrangements with regards to the administration of medicines:

If a child has an EpiPen the school needs to be given two pens. Parents need to keep track of expiry dates and replace them when needed. Due to health and safety reasons we will not be able to take children on any trips if this is not in place.

- Medicines should only be brought to school when essential. In the case of antibiotics, only those prescribed to be taken three or more times a day may be administered at school.
- Prescribed medicines must be in the original container labelled with the child's name and dosage to be accepted in school.
- Medicines will not be accepted in school that require medical expertise or intimate contact unless prior arrangements through a health care plan or personal care plan are in place.
- All medicines must be brought to the school office by an adult. Medicines must NEVER be brought to school in a child's possession.
- The adult is required to complete a parental agreement form at the school office for the medicine to be administered by school staff.
- Painkillers, such as Paracetamol or Ibuprofen, may NOT be brought in to school unless prescribed if children are expected to take them over a period of time. However for other one-off circumstances e.g. headaches, period pains, toothache, paracetamol that has not been prescribed can be brought in to school for staff to administer but a parent/carer agreement form must be signed.
- Parents may come to the school office to administer medicines.

School Uniform

With the colder days approaching, could you please make sure that your child has the appropriate school uniform of navy, black or grey trousers, skirt or pinafore, white or red polo shirt and a red cardigan or jumper. As the office needs to order stock in advance, please do not leave it too late if you want a Bessemer jumper or cardigan. You can find more information and pricing on the school website. Please also ensure that your child has a waterproof coat in school every day.
