Can your child discuss what has happened already and make predictions about what may happen next and why.

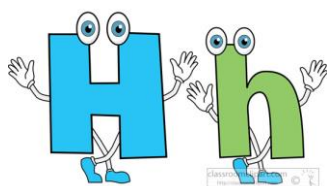
Our Week
